Superintendent Recommendations

Mr. Tim Wilder stated I do not have any budget recommendations tonight for the Board in terms of recommending for the budget; however, on November 22nd something I want Board Members to think about is paying for technology out of Capital Outlay freeing up money in the general operating account. We need to look at the special education teaching needs at Girard and Honeysuckle Middle Schools. We do have money in Capital Outlay and technology is something we can pay from that. I am concerned that we have enough money out of our general operating for

special education help at Honeysuckle and Girard Middle. Discussion was held regarding the Board gets \$2.8 million a year in Capital Outlay from the State, we spend about a \$1 million on debt service, you have \$1.8 million left switching the technology from General Fund to Capital Outlay money would be available and free up money for General Fund, garbage pickup would come out of General Fund for the schools and the CNP will pick up the portion of their costs, one of our schools will require a full-time nurse, one will go to a school with a medical necessity, we only have a nurse going to that school 1 ½ days out of the week, we have reached our limit in terms of keeping up a 2 month fund balance, we can pay for out of Capital Outlay the technology and bathrooms, and request for a full update on the Capital Outlay account next month. Mr. Scott Faulk stated in regards to special education and nursing needs at Honeysuckle Middle School, student safety and success is priority at Honeysuckle, to date we have 56 - 6th grade, 28 - 7th grade and 48 - 8th grade special education students for a total of 132, that is 22% of our student body, we have been successful with testing and increasing test scores, the profound class alone has 7 medically fragile students and 4 physically aggressive students, with the medical issues we have 1 nurse who administered 4,342 doses of medication this past school year, she administered so much that the State Department had to change one of the forms that she has to fill out on behalf of Honeysuckle, she monitored close to 2,000 glucose students for seizures, diabetic care, meal planning, insulin pumps, tube feedings, 7,205 for the entire school year, I hope you do consider the numbers that I have given you as we decide to make sure all of Dothan City Schools are successful. Honeysuckle Middle School has had its most successful year since I have been there for 9 years, the staff and students are 100% buy-in in what we do, we need your help, our Advisory Program is being recognized at the State level, a few staff members and myself will be presenting at Mega Conference this summer, on a National Level the SREB Making Middle Grades Work has recognized about 4 of our programs which is our Goal Setting Day, our Greek House, our Advisory Program and our Male and Female Mentoring Programs, and they have asked for us to present there on a National level.

Mr. Wilder congratulated the Board for re-election and keeping things moving forward.

Mr. Jere Segrest stated the Board Code of Conduct complies with the law.

Mr. Chris Maddox stated Mr. Armstrong and I had some conversations about this Code of Conduct and talked, with all due respect to Mr. Lee whom I like a lot, but the irony of our State Legislature dictating to this School Board needs to adopt a Code of Conduct. We are talking about an entity that is known for punching each other out on the floor of the House. I told Mr. Armstrong I would be a team player but it is unbelievable to me. We do not have problems on our School Board the way we conduct our meetings and we may disagree with each other from time to time but it is always done with respect and courtesy and it is just killing me that we are being asked to vote on a Code of Conduct for ourselves.

Mr. Tim Wilder stated Barbie and Tracy, Mr. Lee said it right, there is no amount of honor that he or anybody else Statewide or System wide can bestow on you two. It is great recognition for this system, your schools, this community and Dothan. We are proud to have them go and be Ambassadors for our system. Also, congratulations to Vanessa Gunn our new Principal at Hidden Lake Elementary School the morning.

Mrs. Allyson Morgan stated we had 700 students in Summer Bridge for two weeks and Mr. Bruner and his department transported 4 year olds and preK to elementary, all four middle schools and both high schools.

Mr. Tim Wilder stated we are changing the August 12 Work Shop to a Special Called meeting. There will be more personnel because of the changes the Board made tonight.

We have already agreed to spend \$500,000 and that will not even touch what we need to do. We have a long wish list and personnel needs in the schools as far as nurses and aides in special education. We need to take care of those things because that directly affects our students. Technology does too so we have to have a plan for it and we need to move forward with technology and probably need to come up with more than \$500,000, probably need to double that just to get started. Dr. Harry Wayne Parrish stated the good thing about it is we all have four more years here to try to help the best we can.
