Parental Involvement/Conferencing Plan

Parental Involvement/Conferencing:

Parental involvement and parental conferencing are recognized by the Dothan City Schools' Board of Education as critical elements in a child's success in school. Each school shall develop

a plan for parental involvement and a plan for parental conferencing to be submitted to the Superintendent or his designee for approval prior to the beginning of school. The plan shall be developed following guidelines distributed to all schools by the Superintendent or his designee.

Guidelines for Parental Involvement:

- 1. Each school shall designate a faculty coordinator for parental involvement who shall serve as chairperson of the faculty committee and shall work in coordination with the building principal in the development and implementation of the parental involvement/parental conferencing plan.
- 2. Each school's annual plan shall include the following components:
 - 1.1 Parent participation component
 - 2.1 Professional development components, objectives and timeline
 - 3.1 Parental in-service/training component
 - 4.1 Goal and objective statements based on results of parent and teacher surveys
 - 5.1 School meeting component
 - 6.1 Information sent home in language the parent can understand

Guidelines for Parental Conferencing Plan and Academic Advisement:

Each school shall develop a plan for Parental/Academic Conferencing, which shall include:

- 1.1 In-service training component for teachers and other affected personnel in conducting effective parent-teacher conference
- 2.1 A plan for encouraging parents to become actively involved in conferences
- 3.1 A plan for documentation of all conferences attempted and held
- 4.1 A plan for communicating on a regular basis through newsletter and other information sent home
- 5.1 A plan for conferencing all parents of K-1 and special education students the first nine weeks
- 6.1 A plan for conferencing the parents of all 2–8 students the first semester

- 7.1 A plan for conferencing the parents of all 9th grade students for academic planning the first semester
- 8.1 A plan for the regular conferencing of all students making D's or F's each nine weeks

Model Plan Goals and Activities:

- GOAL I: To have each parent of kindergarten and first grade children know the teachers, feel comfortable coming into the school, and know ways in which they can help their child at home
- GOAL II: For parents of children not doing well academically in school, to begin helping their child at home

Activities for the Six Components of Parental Involvement Programs:

- 1. Dothan City Schools will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of the LEA Parental Involvement Plan:
 - The LEA Advisory Panel will meet twice a year (Fall and Spring) to review and amend the LEA Parental Involvement Plan and budget. The LEA will contact several Title I, Part A schools and request the name of a parent to serve on the panel. The LEA will then notify the parent representative by mail and provide them with a copy of the present LEA Parental Involvement Plan for them to review and evaluate. Recommended changes will be discussed and voted on at the Advisory Panel meeting.
- 2. Dothan City Schools will implement the following activities to involve parents in the process of school review and improvement:
 - Each school will include parents on their school improvement (ACIP) committee.
 - ➤ Each school will send parent surveys out at the end of the school year seeking their evaluation of the Parental Involvement Program. Parent representatives and the school advisory council in determining needed changes review results of the surveys.
 - Each school will train parents on 1) student assessments 2) curriculum 3) how to help their child achieve academic success 4) the purpose and goal of Title I programs and funds 5) parental rights 6) how to schedule parent conferences and the importance of the parent/teacher relationship.
 - ➤ Each school will make available to parents a copy of the school's Parental Involvement Plan and give each parent a copy of the school's student/parent handbook.

- 3. Dothan City Schools will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I, Part A schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance:
 - ➤ LEA representatives will visit each school during the school year to participate and assist with parent meetings and activities.
 - ➤ LEA representatives will communicate with each school concerning the Parental Involvement Plan and its implementation.
 - > The LEA will assist in helping the schools plan and budget their Parental Involvement allocations.
- 4. Dothan City Schools will coordinate and integrate parental involvement strategies in Title I, Part A with parental involvement strategies under the following other programs, such as Head Start, and Title III (EL) by:
 - > The LEA will provide all school related forms in a language that all parents can understand with the support of the TransAct Program.
 - ➤ The LEA will provide assistance to parents and students through the employment of EL tutors.
 - ➤ The LEA will provide health and safety education to parents through the employment of school nurses. The school nurses work closely with teachers, parents, and students.
 - An LEA representative will support Head Start by attending parent meetings and activities. The Head Start administrator sends a meeting calendar to the LEA.
- 5. Dothan City Schools will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this Parental Involvement Plan in improving the quality of the Title I, Part A schools. The school district will use the findings of the evaluation to design strategies for more effective parental involvement.
 - Each school will conduct yearly surveys that will be sent home at the end of the school year. The Parental Involvement Specialist will be responsible for compiling the data.
 - Each school will use the survey data to make improvements in their Parental Involvement Plan.
 - Each school improvement committee will review the results.

- 6. Dothan City Schools will build the schools and parents' capacity for strong parental involvement, in order to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among school involved & parents to improve academic achievement through the following activities:
 - Each school will conduct meetings for parents in the evening and daytime to discuss various areas of achievement such as; homework, study skills, understanding student assessments, understanding academic content standards, how to work with educators, the requirements of Title I, Part A. Documentation of the workshops, materials for parents, agendas and sign-in sheets will be maintained at each school.
 - ➤ Each school will provide training to teachers concerning the importance of the parent/teacher relationship.
 - Each school will send home information to parents in a language they can understand and respond to via the TransAct Program.
 - Each school will send home newsletters to all parents with homework tips.
 - Each school will send parents interim progress or deficiency reports.
